GUIDELINES FOR FCPS MID-TERM EXAMINEE.

1. **Showing admit card is a prerequisite to enter into the examination hall.**
2. The examination hall will be opened **forty minutes prior** to the commencement of examination.
3. In the Paper-I examination, no examinee will be allowed to enter the examination hall after 15 minutes of the commencement of the examination.
4. In the Paper-II examination, no examinee will be allowed to enter into the examination hall after 30 minutes of the commencement of examination.
5. In the Paper-I examination, no examinee will be allowed to leave the examination hall no sooner than 15 minutes before the end of the examination.
6. In the Paper-II examination, no examinee will be allowed to leave the examination hall within 1 hour of starting the examination.
7. All exit doors are to be closed for the last 15 minutes and the examinees are requested to remain seated in their place until all the scripts are counted and tally with the list of presence. After declaring the end of the counting, the examinees will be allowed to leave.
8. Examinees are to bring their own ballpoint pen, 2B pencil, sharpener and good eraser.
9. The examinees are not allowed to write anything on the admit card, question papers or keep any other papers. These may lead to cancellation of the answer sheet/scripts.
10. No mobile phone, even inactive, is allowed in the Examination Hall. Finding any mobile phone or other electronic devices shall result in expulsion from the examination.

Surgery, Urology, Neuro-surgery, Cardiovascular Surgery, Thoracic Surgery, Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, Orthopaedic Surgery, Paediatric Surgery, Hepatobiliary Surgery, Colorectal Surgery, Surgical Oncology, Casualty and Emergency Surgery, will fill up “**Surgery**” in answer sheet (OMR sheet) and questions will be common.

(c) **Examinees who registered for-**

Paediatrics, Neonatology, Paediatric Haematology & Oncology, Paediatric Nephrology, Paediatric Gastroenterology & Nutrition, Paediatric Pulmonology, Paediatric Neurology & Development, Paediatric Cardiology, Paediatric Endocrinology and Metabolism and Paediatric Critical Care Medicine will fill up “**Paediatrics**” in answer sheet (OMR sheet) and questions will be common.

(d) **Examinees who registered for-**

Obst. & Gynae, Feto-Maternal Medicine, Gynaecological Oncology, Reproductive Endocrinology & Infertility and Female Pelvic Medicine and Reconstructive Surgery will fill up “**Obst. & Gynae**” in answer sheet (OMR sheet) and questions will be common.

(e) **Examinees who registered for-**

Paediatric Ophthalmology and Vitreo-Retina will fill up “**Ophthalmology**” in answer sheet (OMR sheet) and questions will be common.

(f) **Examinees who registered for-**

Child and Adolescent Psychiatry will fill up “**Psychiatry**” in answer sheet (OMR sheet) and questions will be common.

(g) Examinees of remaining subjects will fill up their registered subject in the answer sheet (OMR sheet).

➤ **Competences of the Clinical part of OSCE-**

- History taking with clinical reasoning skills
- Physical examinations with clinical reasoning skills
- Diagnostic workup with formulation of the differential diagnosis

➤ **Competences of the Practical part of OSCE -**

- Imaging (X-ray, CT, MRI, ECG, EEG, photograph etc.)
- Data interpretations
- Communication skills
- Procedural skills

Information to all:

- All stations will be structured & observed
- Two papers (Paper-I & Paper-II) in written test will be calculated together
- Clinical and Practical part of the examinations of OSCE will be calculated together
- Candidates those who will pass the written examinations, he/she will be eligible for OSCE.

14. Paper-I, OMR Sheet:

(The part of the OMR sheet which includes roll number, set code (only applicable for Medicine & Allied specialities), candidates name & signature and subject name should be written with a ballpoint pen at the beginning of the examination. 2B pencil must be used for filling circles).

15. Paper-II, OMR Sheet:

The part of the OMR sheet (cover page) which includes name, roll number, subject name, exam name and paper should be written with a ballpoint pen at the beginning of the examination. 2B pencil must be used for filling circles.
